"Science is Important, but It Isn't Everything" deals with my relationship over many months with a 14-year-old girl paralyzed by a fungal infection, which no leukemic child like her had ever survived. I was making progress with the experimental medication I was instilling into her brain, but because of intense pain and fever, she seemed to be losing the will to go on. So like a reverse Scheherazade, I spun out a long story to keep my patient alive. It was about a lonely dragon and some gallant mice and it always ended with a cliff hanger so that, to hear the next installment, she had to stay alive one more day, and another, and another.

Dr. Nagami, a Yale University of Medicine graduate, was a practicing physician in internal medicine and infectious diseases with the Southern California Permanente Medical Group and a Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine at UCLA. She has made appearances on CNN and NPR





Dave has trained thousands of IT security and citizens in the disciplines of in-depth cyber security, risk reduction, and Internet investigations. Before joining the LADA, Babcock was a police officer for the City of Glendale. Dave served in the United States Marine Corps and is a graduate of the Illinois Institute of Technology with a degree in chemical engineering.
